

National Ocean Policy Implementation Plan

- In 2010, President Obama created a National Ocean Policy and framework for regions to coordinate marine planning (Exec. Order 13547).
- Released by White House on April 16, 2013
- Encourages regions to identify and address their ocean priorities through marine planning.

Mid-Atlantic Regional Planning Body (MidA RPB)

- Established in April 2013
- Intergovernmental group created to coordinate and implement regional ocean planning
- Includes representatives of:
 - Six Mid-Atlantic states (NY, NJ, PA, DE, MD and VA),
 - Shinnecock Indian Nation
 - Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council
 - Eight federal agencies

What is the purpose of the MidA RPB?

To coordinate among State, Federal, Tribal, and Fishery Management Council representatives to:

- Plan for new and existing uses in the Mid-Atlantic ocean
- Improve efficiency and leverage constrained resources
- Work together and with stakeholders to share and vet ocean data
- Engage stakeholders and the public in creating a vision and achieving that vision
- Make better, more informed decisions about the use of ocean space


Mid-Atlantic Regional Council on the Ocean (MARCO)

- Established in 2009 by the Governors of New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland and Virginia to work on shared regional ocean issues that benefit from interstate collaboration and coordinated problem solving.
- Provides a valuable forum to pursue mutual goals shared by the Mid-Atlantic states;
- Improves responses to ocean management challenges and opportunities; and
- Collaborates with agencies, key partners, and stakeholder groups to jointly address the region's needs.
