

Second update of the 2011 Helicopter Monitoring Program

Floatables:

The New York/New Jersey Harbor Complex was monitored for floatables six times from June 4 - 10. The Harbor was clear of significant floatables on June 4, 6 and 8th.

On June 7, a floatable slick, approximately 400 yards long was reported in the Gravesend Bay.

On June 9, two floatable slicks, each approximately 100 to 150 yards long with varying widths, were reported in Newark Bay.

On June 10, a floatable slick, approximately 150 yards long by 3 yards wide, was reported in the Upper Harbor. A floatable slick, approximately 400 yards long was reported in Newark Bay. A patch of debris, approximately 150 yards by 200 yards was also reported in Newark Bay.

All floatable debris slick consisted of wood, plastic and paper, were reported to the Army Corps of Engineers, and cleanup was conducted as necessary.
